Melanie Hunt, the artist behind Feather & Fern studio is both a potter and a fibre artist. Clay was her first love; her pots are formed using both slab building techniques as well as the wheel. Melanie loves to find ways to incorporate her love of nature into the pots by texturing with plants found in her garden or fossils found on the beach. Her weavings are made using wool, alpaca, thrifted fibres as well as hand spun. Landscape and seasons are the inspiration behind her woven stories and the making of them is a most meditative process.

9. JACK OLIVE, 14 MAIN ST, KAGAWONG

Jack Olive's work in clay is functional and decorative – wheel thrown, and slab built and fired to cone one with over and under glaze decoration. All pieces are food safe, and the wheel thrown ones are oven and microwave proof. He has formulated his clay and glazes to fit so that there is no problem with crazing. The slight compression of the glaze creates a very durable and chip resistant surface.
