Work begins in the field and is completed in the studio; when opportunity arises, work is completed plein-air painting. The painting and original hand pulled serigraphs capture a moment in time filled with colour and natural light.

**Steven Fox-Radulovich** is an Anishinaabe maker from M’Chigeeng First Nation living in Gageigawan (Kagawong). Working primarily with rescue wood, he creates functional and sculptural objects that reveal story through grain, form, and character. Rooted in material, place, and process, his practice bridges craft, memory, and contemporary Indigenous expression.

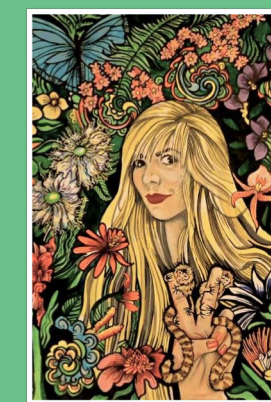
